Kickboxing: Trio becomes the first Southeast Asians to be Kickboxing Referees



Nazri, Valencia and Joel officiated in the 2022 WAKO World Championships (Children, Cadet and Juniors) and earned their gold cards

1. The 2022 World Association of Kickboxing Organizations (WAKO) World Championships held in Jesolo, Italy from 30 September to 9 October proved to be a monumental milestone for the Kickboxing Federation of Singapore (KFS). The trio comprising of Muhammad Nazri Sutari, Valencia Yip and Joel Lye became official 'C' Class referees for Tatami Sports, under WAKO. This comes after 6 days of extensive work, each officiating over 200 matches at the competition which saw nearly 2,000 athletes from 62 countries.

2. Kickboxing under WAKO comprises of 7 disciplines across 2 environments; Ring and Tatami. The trio became the first in Southeast Asia to attain such a qualification in Tatami Sports. The license will enable holders to officiate in any competitions from World Cups to Continental Championships.

3. This milestone is the first step towards promoting the sport of Kickboxing in Singapore, as the federation seeks to promote Tatami sports and organize more activities, with the objective of developing a wide pool of grassroot talent.

4. Nazri shares, "I've always been the athlete and not the official. So becoming an official licensed referee is an entirely new game. There is a lot of technical knowledge you need to have and make crucial split-second decisions. Ultimately, I believe this will help improve my fighting performance because now I know what the referees and judges are really looking out for."

5. The World Championship saw athletes as young as 7 up till the age of 18 compete in fighting disciplines and Musical Forms.

6. Jason Lim, president of KFS shares, "Apart from getting their official licenses, I believe what's more important is bringing back their learning experiences from the World Championship. We want to bring that level of technical expertise in terms of officiating and organization, so that participants can expect the fairest competition with the highest standards, be it grassroot competitions or national championships. We learn from the best and extract their wisdom to apply it here in Singapore."

7. Mr Brian Beck, Chairman of Tatami Sports and World Chief Referee comments, "*It is my greatest pleasure* to award the official licenses to the deserving trio from Singapore. They are one of the best referees l've seen in Southeast Asia and even in Asia. They are confident and competent both inside and outside the tatami. I am excited to see what's next for them and will be glad to train them and build their capabilities."

8. The referee contingent from Singapore has received compliments from various coaches and national delegates. Safeguarding Officer from Great Britain, Mr Gordon Mitchell, says "*I've been watching the Singapore representatives perform in their refereeing roles. They are very competent and as a coach, I would be more than happy to have them officiating my athletes.*"
