Kickboxing: A Silver Shot in the Arm for SEA Games

Nazri beats the world number 8 country to claim Singapore's first Ring medal at an European-level cup

Singapore, 9 May 2023 – Singapore made its mark nearly 10,000km away, in the capital of Bosnia & Herzegovina as kickboxing pioneer, Nazri Sutari, seized his first Ring sport medal at the World Association of Kickboxing Organizations (WAKO) Sarajevo European Cup.

In a thrilling semi-final which saw Nazri come back from a trailing first round, the kickboxing trailblazer regained composure to skillfully dominate the remaining two to defeat his North Macedonian adversary, Ahmeti Metin in the 71kg Low Kick event. The country is ranked eighth in the world for the Low Kick discipline.

Nazri fought down to the wire, settling for silver after a narrow loss in the finals against Montenegro's Nemanja Cadjenovic, the reigning champion.



En route his quest for the republic's first kickboxing medal at the South East Asian Games (SEA Games), this silver will be a shot in the arm for Nazri's third outing in four days' time. Nazri increases his *personal best* medal haul for the republic totaling 4 medals, comprising of 2 silvers and 2 bronze.



Speaking just before he boarded the plane back to Singapore, Nazri shares, "With every successive competition, I accomplish a greater achievement than before. My coach (Aleksandar Topic) and I noticed this upward progression after conducting a post-fight reflection, so I believe we're heading in the right direction. 7 months ago, I got bronze and now silver. So I'm definitely going to keep aiming higher."

Alluding to his upcoming SEA Games event, Nazri adds on, "This silver couldn't have come at a better time. It's a real confidence booster just before I head into the competition. Right now, I'm really fired up and just raring to go."

President of Kickboxing Federation of Singapore (KFS), Jason Lim comments, "As humans, sometimes we need reminders of what we're capable of to push us further. I believe this is exactly what

Nazri needed for the final leg of this journey. Aside from that, I am very proud of what he has accomplished. To sacrifice everything, train and compete overseas, produce great results, to be able to do all this alone is a feat by itself."

Nazri and his coach, Aleksandar Topic, will fly into Singapore at 9:25pm tonight, and will depart for Cambodia at 12:05pm the next day.
